EDITORS' GREETING

The *Journal of Historians of Netherlandish Art* is pleased to publish three articles on 15th and 16th-century Netherlandish art. The first, an essay on the *Turin-Milan Hours* by Carol Herselle Krinsky, uses heraldry, biographical research, information about manuscript production, and visual analysis to deny authorship of the Hand G miniatures to Jan van Eyck. Maryan Ainsworth and Abbie Vandivere publish Jan Cornelisz Vermeyen's earliest signed painting, *Judith with the Head of Holofernes*, and argue a date of ca. 1525–30. Barbara A. Kaminska's essay, "Come, let us make a city and a tower': Pieter Bruegel the Elder's *Tower of Babel* and the Creation of a Harmonious Community in Antwerp," discusses the iconography and display of Pieter Bruegel the Elder's *Tower of Babel* in the context of the early modern tradition of learned dinner conversation.

The issue concludes with the fourth installment of Tom van der Molen's critical translation of D. C. Meijer Jr.'s five-part article on the Amsterdam civic guard portraits, published in one of the first issues of *Oud Holland*. This installment focuses on the portraits of Thomas de Keyser. Translations of the first three installments can be found in *JHNA* 5:1 (2013) and 6:1 (2014).

Looking forward to the seventh volume (2015) of JHNA, we will publish articles based on some of the excellent papers delivered at the HNA conference in Boston this past June. Others include Tom van der Molen's translation of the fifth and last installment of D.C.Meijer's article from Oud Holland 7 (1889)

On the technical side, we are pleased to report our improved method for creating pdf files, thanks to the help of Elise Braden, Academic Technology Associate, Carleton College. And we look forward to the upgrading of Joomla, our website platform, later in the fall.
